

The history of Indus.

The flagship Indus International School was founded on the ethos of 'In Omnia Paratus - Prepared For All Challenges'. At Indus, this preparation is accomplished through nurturing multiple intelligences and endowing children with the ability to learn and adapt to change. Indus International School, Bangalore, was established by the Indus Trust on July 14, 2003, at Sarjapur, Bangalore, on a 40-acre site within the IT corridor. Since then, the Trust has established two more international schools, in Pune and Hyderabad, respectively.

The Indus International School, Bangalore, began its first academic year in 2003, with 135 students. Based on a conscious decision to ensure quality learning, the School graduated from Grade 9 to Grade 12 over a span of three years. Today, the School has over 1200 students from 38 countries, with 25 percent of the students living on campus.

The functioning of the School is overseen by a CEO and a team of Directors. The Directors combine their vision, energy and expertise, to determine long-range policies that benefit both staff and students. The School is run by the Indus Trust, comprising members who represent the IT sector, real estate development and business investment.

Presently, the School provides the International Baccalaureate's (IB) Primary Years Programme (Prep to Grade 5); International Baccalaureate's (IB) Middle Year Programme); and the IB Diploma Programme (Grades 11 and 12). Students from Grade 5 onwards use laptops and can access the internet anywhere, anytime.

The Indus School of Leadership

"Indus School of Leadership (ISL) is one of India's premier leadership training institutes. The leadership development philosophy is based on acquiring the ability to lead oneself first, then others. Consequently, we focus on the process of experiential learning with guided reflection for a heightened self-awareness. The Indus School of Leadership (ISL) imparts experiential leadership training to students. Children from all grades attend outward bound sessions in decisionmaking, problem-solving, risk-taking and innovation. The ISL runs training sessions on campus for Grades 1 and 2, and at Kanakpura School of leadership for students from Grade 3-12. The overall theme for the sessions is "Reconnect with Nature, Self and Community.

The Leadership Curriculum at Indus focuses on self-actualization of the students, helping them value their talent to ultimately unlock their potential. Knowledge acquired from the classrooms to a large extent augment practical understanding. But, to go beyond that, and become the knowledge itself is what the main agenda of the leadership curriculum is; connecting the child to the society, to the environment and most importantly to the self are the major outcomes.



TED-Ed sessions leading to I-Lead talks, where every child is encouraged to come with an original idea or a story that can inspire his immediate and proximate surroundings form part of the leadership curriculum from PYP through DP. The sessions while focusing on communication skills of students, on a larger note, aims at preparing the student with the critical competencies of the 21st century, like, creativity, critical thinking, collaboration, etc.

Regular sessions on Mindfulness help students connect with themselves, and live the moment happily. When they understand what true happiness

is, they become the change agents of creating happiness for themselves and for others. By being Mindful, students understand the core values of 'love', 'respect', 'empathy' and 'discipline' with more clarity. Community service also form context to the leadership curriculum; students, through their house visions work toward giving back to the society that they are directly and indirectly part of.


Community Service

Parent Advisory Committee

A well-structured parental participation programme supports the School, strengthens families and increases student achievement and success. The Parent Advisory Committee provides an opportunity to Indus parents to share their ideas and concerns, provide on-

going communication between parents and the management, and collaborate on school initiatives.

Mentoring

Mentoring is another powerful leadership development tool used extensively at Indus. All students from Grade 6 and above are assigned teacher-mentors who conduct mentoring sessions once a week. In addition, nominated teachers are mentored personally by the CEO and the Principal.

Student Council

The Student Council comprises students from all grades who are nominated to the Council for a term of one year. Under the leadership of a Head Boy and Head Girl, the Student Council appointees receive hands-on experience in leadership and organising events. The Student Council is an avenue for students' voices to be heard.





Sports and Games

Realising that a disciplined approach towards maintaining physical fitness is an important facet of leadership and overall well-being, Indus provides the following sports facilities:

Pastoral Care

Pastoral care at Indus is designed to provide a nurturing environment for students to enable them to achieve academic excellence as well as cope with various emotional experiences. A mentor mentee system is followed to ensure the emotional and psychological well-being of the students. Each boarder is assigned a residential staff as a mentor. Outstanding and effective support is also being provided by house parents as well as Head of Pastoral Care. The mentor is in touch with the students on a daily basis to enquire about their well-being, academic performance, extra-curricular activities and any other emotional concerns. They regularly co-ordinate with the parents & teachers as well.

We have moved beyond the hostel accommodation and believe in empowering the child so that he/she takes charge of his/her own life. We also aim at providing exceptional opportunities that are not easily available. Apart from a designated counselor for the boarding, special CAS and sports programs are introduced along with the following:

- Boarding Orchestra
- · Professional Deep Reading Program
- · The concept of making your own bed
- Service component (Boarders adopting the Handanhalli Government School)

College Counselling & guidance

Counselling and guidance for higher education are provided by a team of dedicated counselors, experts in this field who specialises in student support, higher education guidance and college and university placement for every student. This process begins ideally in Grade 9, but can also start in Grade 11 depending upon when the student joins Indus. It involves multiple personalized meetings between student and assigned counsellor, group workshops, frequent information exchange with parents. The department has liaised with a SAT coaching institution named Test Rocker to assist students who wish to take the SAT aptitude test.

Indus students have gained admission to Upenn, Columbia, Rice, University of Chicago, Babson, University of Southern California, Hamilton, Emory, Emory, UC Berkley, Claremont McKenna in USA; London School of Economics, University of Cambridge, Imperial college, Bristol and Kings in UK. The University of British Columbia, University of Toronto, Waterloo & McMasters in Canada. Besides getting into European Schools such as Erasmus in the Netherlands, Navarra in Spain, Amsterdam in the Netherlands.

Humanoid teacher A Path breaking Innovation in Education

Many instances in the past have proved that human intelligence when coupled with artificial intelligence can do wonders. Keeping that in mind, Indus International School, Bangalore (IISB) is the first school in the world to introduce the Collaborative Learning Model (CLM), where teachers will have robot assistants while delivering lessons in classrooms. These robots will never replace teachers, but they will share the everyday responsibilities of a teacher. This will allow teachers sufficient time to focus more on concepts, their relevance and application and mentoring the students. The CLM is being implemented for Grades 7, 8 and 9 for Physics, Biology, Chemistry, History and Geography.



Teacher Training

Indus International Schools, under the able leadership of the CEO, Lt. Gen (Retd) Arjun Ray and the Principal, Mrs Sarojini Rao, continue to organize structured Leadership Training for Faculty Members and Heads of various Indus Institutions regularly. Leadership is the central philosophy of Indus International Schools and Leadership Training is organized in a systematic manner from Basic to Advanced level conferences and interactive retreats focusing on various aspects of self-development imperative for professional development, streamlined through Track 1 to Track 3 level. Considerable investment on all fronts is made by the Senior Management in organizing these training programmes for several years and have been highly productive for faculty and institutional growth.

Leadership Track 1 retreats, are foundational programmes, compulsory for all Indus faculty members as well as ITARI trainee-teachers and address aspects of key responsibility areas (KRA's), school vision, school mission, goal setting, self-development plans, resilience, emotional quotient, happiness quotient, time-management and work-life balance. The Leadership Track 2 training programmes are offered for interested faculty members and administrators. Several Indus faculty opt for further advancement in understanding and implementing aspects of whole education, leadership styles, systems and processes, mentoring, crucible experiences, servant leadership, community welfare projects, and personal SWOT analysis, conducted in-depth through the Track 2 interactive workshops. The Leadership Track 1 and Track 2 programmes (3 day workshops) are city specific, and organized in Indus Bangalore, Pune and Hyderabad biannually.

The curriculum at Indus is designed to bring out the best in every child, and to help them develop a passion for lifelong learning. At Indus, knowledge is not merely 'about' natural sciences, social sciences and the arts. Knowledge is experiential and transformational.

IB Primary Years Programme for Prep to Grade 5, emphasises trans-disciplinary and inquiry-based learning. Children's interests and questions are incorporated into each of the units so that the students learn how to ask questions, plan investigations, solve problems and find answers to their questions.

IB MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME(IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP) emphasises on intellectual and creative thinking. It encourages students from 11-16 years of age to make practical connections between their studies and the real world. This prepares them to succeed in further studies and also in life. The MYP aims to develop active learners and thoughtful young people who can empathise with others and pursue lives of purpose and meaning. The programme empowers students to inquire into a wide range of issues and develop ideas which are significant at local, national and global levels. As students graduating from one of the country's top IB schools, they bear

traits of creative, reflective and critical thinking. The Middle Years Programme (MYP) helps students develop both, subject-specific and interdisciplinary understanding.

Indus International School is a candidate school* for the International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Programme and is pursuing authorization as an IB World School.).

The IB Diploma Programme (IB DP) is a challenging two-year curriculum for Grades 11 and 12, and it prepares students for University. The IB DP is widely recognised by the world's leading universities. It is inquiry and application based, as opposed to rote and purely theoretical learning. It encourages students to ask challenging questions, learn how to learn, and develop a strong sense of their own identity. The IB Diploma Programme contains six subject groups together with a core made up of three parts. All three parts of the core - Extended Essay, Theory of Knowledge and Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) - are compulsory and are central to the philosophy of the Diploma Programme.

Special Educational Needs (SEN)

Indus International School believes in offering our students every support to ensure success in their academic, social and co-curricular activities. We recognise that children with learning disabilities learn best when sensitively mainstreamed into core classes where differentiated instruction will enable the students to perform effectively.

Our Special Educators work closely with mainstream teachers to provide them with effective teaching strategies to use in the integrated classroom. Remedial classes in Reading, Spelling, Writing, and Comprehension are also factored into the school day.



English as Second Language (ESL)

The ESL department at Indus offers English classes that are carefully designed according to the latest research in teaching English as a second language. The teaching techniques and materials used help our non-English speaking students learn the language skills of Speaking, Reading, Listening, Viewing, and Presenting that is expected of students in any international school.

Head Start to IBDP

It is an irrefutable fact that IB DP is an academically challenging and balanced programme of education that prepares students for success at University and especially for life beyond. Since our motto is to educate students who are 'Prepared for all challenges' in future, it is paramount that they are well versed with the requirements of IB DP and the IB Philosophy. We have often noticed students finding it very challenging to cope with the rigor of the

IB DP, especially in the core components (CAS, TOK & EE) of the IB DP.

'Head Start to IB DP' is an initiative by Indus Schools to prepare students to excel in the IB DP. It is a focused and academically rigorous programme covering a range of IB subjects, designed to help our students reach the required entry level for their IB Diploma. This programme will train students to develop a range of academic skills such as critical thinking, writing, and internet research, all of which are indispensable for success in the IB DP.


